Transportation department extends public comment period for rule governing oversized shipments on U.S. 12

BOISE - The public comment period on a proposed rule that would regulate non-reducible, oversized shipments on a section of U.S. 12 has been extended to Friday, Oct. 14.

Originally, the comment period was scheduled to conclude Sept. 30.

The comment period is part of an effort to gather public input on the rule.

In addition to the comment period, a public hearing is being held Wednesday (**Sept. 28**) from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. (MDT). The hearing will be available at transportation department district offices via video conference in Coeur d'Alene, Lewiston, Shoshone, Pocatello, Rigby and transportation department headquarters in Boise.

Following legal action in 2013, a district court affirmed the U.S. Forest Service had a duty to regulate oversized loads traveling through the Clearwater National Forest. The Forest Service issued written criteria to determine which loads will be subject to Forest Service review.

At the public hearing, attendees will be able to comment on a proposed rule that would set forth the conditions that non-reducible, oversized loads using U.S. 12 would follow, from Milepost 75.2 (close to the junction of U.S. 12 and Idaho 13) to Milepost 174.4 (the Idaho/Montana state line).

The proposed rule the Idaho Transportation Department is taking comment on would apply to shipments that:

- Exceed 16 feet in width or 150 feet in length
- Require longer than 12 hours to travel through the Wild and Scenic River Corridor and National Forest (the section of U.S. 12 that is from Milepost 75.2 to Milepost 174.4)
- Require physical modification of the roadway or adjacent vegetation to facilitate passage beyond normal highway maintenance.

Non-reducible loads carry cargo that cannot be reduced in size to make a shipment lighter. Examples of non-reducible shipments are heavy equipment or wind turbine blades.
