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#### **Executive Summary**

The Idaho Transportation Department's Office of Highway Safety (OHS) is proud to partner with the National Highway Traffic Safety Adminsitration (NHTSA) as we work toward reducing and ultimately eliminating fatalities and serious injuries on Idaho's roads. Tragically, fatalities have increased this year, after four years of decreasing numbers. OHS has used the NHTSA funds to focus on activities related to educating the public and supporting law enforcement who are on the road each day working hard to save lives. These activities align with what was established in the FFY '21 Highway Safety Plan and the five-year Strategic Highway Safety Plan. Here is a look back at some of the highlights for this past year:

- OHS partnered with many different innovative businesses and organizations to help Shift the
  conversation to positive messaging related to behavioral safety. Here is a list of some of our
  many partners: Learfield Sports, Boise Hawks, Idaho Falls Chukars, Grease Monkey, Idaho
  Power, D93 News, NFHS, Idahosports.com, AMI Entertainment, Duft Watterson, Riester, Office
  of Drug Policy, MADD, law enforcement agencies, and many more.
- Law enforcement agencies began issuing citations as part of Idaho's Hands Free Law on January 1, 2021. A statewide distracted driving mobilization occurred in April 2021, as part of National Distracted Driving Awareness Month.
- Two statewide Highway Safety Summits were held: one virtually and one in person. Idaho State Police Colonel Kedrick Wills was our keynote for the virtual Summit, and participants were able to join in on a variety of breakout sessions on their own time. Nearly 250 people attended the in person Summit in Boise, and there were many great keynote speakers and breakout sessions held there. It was wonderful to network and share ideas.
- A new Child Passenger Liaison Team was established, following the model of the successful Law Enforcement Liaison Team. There is a liaison for each of the seven Public Health Districts, and were able to help the technicians and the public with child passenger safety related questions and concerns. CPS Statewide Coordinator Carma McKinnon continued to lead a solid program to keep kids safe in Idaho.
- The Statwide Electronic Ticketing (SWET) program continued to expand across the state. There are now 49 law enforcement agencies using SWET, along with Port of Entry.
- Two Idaho counties were recognized in FFY '21 for zero fatalities in CY 2020: Benewah & Camas.
- Note: Idaho took advantage of the Maintenance of Effort waiver that NHTSA allowed in FFY '21

Partnerships and engagement were important themes in FFY '21: working together toward a common goal of saving lives. As you read this Annual Report, take note of the partnerships that were established and strengthened as these activities were carried out. Focus on the engagement of those who cared enough to make a difference in their communities.

Thank you to everyone who took part in this important effort of highway safety!


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### **Performance Measures and Targets**

As evidenced in the graph below, the trend of the 5 year average fatalities from 2007 to 2014 was decreasing and the goals were set in accordance with that decreasing trend. In the time since the goals were set, fatalities have increased, resulting in the goals not being achieved. The vertical Yellow line denotes the data that was available when the yellow targets were set, the vertical blue line denotes the data that was available (up to 2017) when the blue targets (2020-2022) were set.

The performance measures have been reassessed and new goals have been set for FFY2022 and future Highway Safety Plans.

#### A summary of findings for 2020

- The number of motor vehicle crashes decreased by 16.6 percent, from 27,015 in 2019 to 22,528 in 2020. The number of fatalities resulting from motor vehicle crashes decreased from 224 in 2019 to 214 in 2020, a 6.5 percent decrease. The number of fatal crashes decreased from 201 in 2019 to 188 in 2020. The number of suspected serious injuries decreased from 1,154 in 2019 to 1,102 in 2020, a 4.5 percent decrease.
- Idaho's fatality rate per 100 million vehicle miles traveled was 1.23 in 2020, down slightly from 1.24 in 2019.
- While 65 percent of all motor vehicle crashes occurred on urban roadways, 77 percent of the fatal motor vehicle crashes occurred on rural roadways in 2020.
- Fatalities resulting from impaired driving crashes decreased in 2020 by 7 percent and 43 percent of all fatalities resulted from impaired driving. Of the 92 people killed in impaired driving crashes, 77 (84 percent) were either the impaired driver, a person riding with an impaired driver, or an impaired pedestrian.
- Idaho's observed seat belt was 85.7 percent in 2019. No observational survey was done in 2020 due
  to COVID-19. Only 35 percent of the motor vehicle occupants killed in crashes were wearing seat
  belts. If everyone had been wearing seat belts, 43 of the 86 unbelted motor vehicle occupants may
  have been saved.
- Aggressive driving was a contributing factor in 48 percent of the motor vehicle crashes and 78 people were killed in aggressive driving crashes in 2020.
- Distracted driving was a factor in 19 percent of the motor vehicle crashes in 2020 and 22 people were killed in distracted driving crashes.
- Youthful drivers, ages 15 to 19, continue to be over-involved in motor vehicle crashes. In 2020, youthful drivers were 2.6 times as likely as all other drivers to be involved in a fatal or injury crash. There were 32 people killed in crashes involving youthful drivers in 2020.
- The number of motorcyclists killed in motor vehicle crashes increased to 27 in 2020. Just over half (52 percent) of fatal motorcycle crashes in 2020 involved just the motorcycle and more than a third (41 percent) of fatal motorcycle crashes involved an impaired motorcycle driver.
- There were 14 pedestrians and 3 bicyclists killed in motor vehicle crashes in 2020.
- Fatal crashes involving commercial motor vehicles increased from 34 in 2019 to 37 in 2020. The number of injury crashes involving commercial motor vehicles increased by 4 percent. There were 42 people killed and 1,024 people injured in commercial motor vehicle crashes in 2020.

#### **Mobilizations and Evidence Based Enforcement**

Executing effective High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) requires enforcement efforts targeted to the appropriate behavioral areas and locations coupled with meaningful media and public education outreach. The agencies' evidence-based traffic safety enforcement programs implement a three-step strategy to ensure effectiveness: Data Analysis, Resource Allocation, and Project Oversight. The strategy starts with an annual analysis of serious injury and fatality data to identify problems and ultimately allocate funding to projects through the annual grants process. ITD-OHS staff work closely with law enforcement agencies to ensure HVE mobilizations are carried out successfully.

Idaho's Law Enforcement Liaison's (LEL), which are represented by six officers, one from each of the six Idaho Transportation Districts, provide leadership for the evidence based traffic safety mobilization enforcements by increasing participation and effectiveness of Idaho's law enforcement agencies and officers in statewide mobilizations The LEL's also serve as oversight and purveyors of HVE best practices. The result is an evidence based traffic safety HVE project designed to address the areas and locations at highest risk and with the greatest potential for improvement. Data analysis is constantly updated and evaluated providing for continuous and timely revisions to enforcement deployment and resource allocation.

Each Agency enters into an agreement with the OHS to perform dedicated patrol for traffic enforcement. For the impaired driving mobilizations, the OHS encourages participants to conduct enforcement during time frames that are data driven; nighttime hours. Funding for these campaigns are allocated to locations throughout the state using demographic, traffic safety data, and agency past performance.

As part of each mobilization, participating agencies publicize the HVE efforts with local media contacts to increase awareness and provide results before, during, and after mobilizations. Idaho closely mirrors NHTSA's timeline for media. OHS distributes a press release template prior to the mobilization to the participating agencies. The agencies used the information in the press release to generate 396 outreach efforts, the majority being social media, and earned media generated by local news outlets.

The OHS has a year-long grant with the Idaho State Police to provide sustained high visibility enforcement throughout the year. In addition to participating in every HVE mobilization, ISP officers are working additional focused enforcement. Enforcement is conducted using data driven approaches in order to achieve success. Idaho has 44 county sheriff offices and 75 police departments. The Idaho State Police also participated in all HVE mobilizations. Below is a list of the agencies that participated in the 2021 mobilizations.

Coeur d'Alene had two STEP grants. One for sustained traffic enforcement and one specifically for sustained DUI enforcement. Boise Police Department, Meridian Police Department and Nampa Police Department had year-long grants for sustained enforcement. All year-longs grant recipients participate in the scheduled HVE mobilizations. There was an increase from 63 agencies participating in FY20, to 67 in FY21.


