

When Riding Your Bicycle....




Proper Fitting Helmet

Wear your helmet the right way. Do not tilt it too far forward or too far back. Your helmet should be snug. One finger should fit between the chin and chin strap. Shake your head. If the fit is right, your helmet will stay on tight.










Hand Signals

Remember to use proper hand signals when turning, or stopping your bike. Signals will let vehicle drivers know your intentions.





Safety Tips:

Remember to always yield to pedestrians and pass carefully on the left.

Before you ride your bike, check it over to make sure it is safe to ride.

Ride Safe

- Ride with traffic, on the right half of the road.
- 2. Ride a safe functioning bike. Check ABC
 - A = Tires are properly filled with AIR
 - **B** = **B**RAKES are working properly
 - C = CHAIN is tight.
- 3. Obey applicable traffic laws.
- 4. Ride in control.
 - Ride in a straight line, don't weave.
 - · Watch for and avoid road hazards.
 - Don't carry things in your hands that will affect your control.
- 5. Wear a properly fitting helmet.
- 6. Use proper hand signals.
- Be seen. Wear light colored clothing at all times and reflective gear when light conditions are low. Use a headlight and taillight when riding at night.
