Dear Mr. Stokes:

This amendment approval amends the 2022 STIP to include 23 projects and to increase project costs for two projects, as requested in ITD's November 2, 2022 letter. This approval is based on the following:

- The changes to the program are not intermodal in nature and will not affect the State's conformity process and, therefore, FHWA has sole approval authority.
- ITD certifies that unanticipated funds from BIL and state funds maintain fiscal constraint.
- ITD certifies they have the mechanisms in place to ensure compliance with new rules required by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
- This action does not serve as an eligibility determination of approval of Federal participation as some programs may have additional program requirements (e.g. the National Highway Freight Program)

In consideration of the above, ITD's 2022 STIP Amendment #H16 is approved as requested.

The attached list includes 25 projects separated by area. 23 of these projects are new to the STIP and 2 are existing. All projects included in this request went out for a 30-day public comment from July 1 – July 31, 2022 as part of the FY23-29 ITIP Draft Program process. These were each included in the FY 2023 – 2029 Recommended Program approved by the Idaho Transportation Board at their September 22, 2022 meeting. These projects have preliminary engineering, right of way, or construction costs scheduled in FY 2023. These development costs are needed in FY 2023 so the projects can be started as soon as possible, so they were added as opposed to advancing other existing STIP projects forward. There is also a cost increase for construction on two projects due to advances made available with end-of-year redistribution.

The five Metropolitan Planning Organizations updated their individual Transportation Improvement Programs as follows: Kootenai Metropolitan Planning Organization – 10/14/22; Lewis-Clark Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization – 9/8/22; Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho – 11/1/22; Bannock Transportation Planning Organization – 10/12/22; and Bonneville Metropolitan Planning Organization – 10/13/22.

The Department requests that the addition of these projects be amended to the FY 2022 – 2028 STIP so that funds may be obligated as planned. The full FY 2023 – 2029 STIP will be submitted to FHWA/FTA in November.

No further public involvement or air quality conformity analysis is required. The Idaho Transportation Department certifies that the above actions meet all applicable requirements as described in 23 CFR 450.218 of *Planning Assistance and Standards*. The STIP continues to be consistent with the Idaho Transportation Department's 2040 Long-Range Transportation Plan as approved by the Idaho Transportation Board in 2019.
