

Fatalities

Injuries

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- Requires hospitalization for more than 48 hours within 7 days of the event;
- Results in fracture of any bone (except simple fractures);
- Causes severe hemorrhages, or nerve, muscle, or tendon damage;
- Involves an internal organ; or
- Involves 2nd or 3rd degree burns, or any burns affecting more than 5% of the body surface.

Statewide Performance Measures


